There will be a premeeting before every Partnership Board meeting where we will talk about what we are going to say.








To be an Elected Representative, you will need to:

You will have a supervision every few months to discuss how you are doing.


You will be part of important meetings about services for people with learning disabilities in Leeds


You can put this role on a CV when you apply for a paid role and Advonet will give you a reference.

How long will it take?









There will be 3 Elected Representatives at one time

They will hold the role for 1 year.

They will need to commit to the 4 Partnership Board meetings and 4 premeetings held the week before.

They may be shadowed by someone else. They could be someone with a learning disability, a councillor or a professional.
